- School Population Update The presentation will be linked to these minutes. Highlights will be noted here.
  - Enrollment for 2025-26 year: 629 students and 30 staff.
  - Wellness Goal for the school over 2 3 years: 60% of students have said they have an adult in the building that they connect with on a social level. The hope is that number goes up to 100% to encourage and improve the sense of belonging and feeling cared for.
  - Staff is trying to alleviate the need to "catch up" after the extended absence to reduce anxiety.
  - Staff gave thanks to all the parents for the support on the return to school day and ongoing support.
- Staff Professional Learning -
  - School wide implementation of social development has been positive.

- Fridays are double homeroom days, and if a student has an IPP, their homeroom teacher is their person to help with any additional support regarding their learning needs.
- Homeroom is where they talk about any social events (truth and reconciliation etc.) and emotional wellbeing and how to understand, regulate and communicate their emotional needs.

- Parent Questions
  - Question about the Quebec trip and the waitlist. 15-20 kids waitlisted seemed like a lot, and the parent would like to know if there's an option to help include these waitlisted kids? Rishma's response is that it really comes down to the amount of work and time that the staff have available to take the trip. They don't have enough staff to do two trips. It is completely voluntary. It is a very demanding trip for the staff members who attend. They would need another

full group to make a second trip work, if they only had ½ the group (20 students) the cost would go up enormously. The max is set to 49 to make the trip cost effective and also because of the size of the bus during the trip.

- Anything parents can do to support teachers?
  - Our heart is with the students. We love the six hours we're with them everyday. Morale is tough and a bit low right now. We love what we do.
  - Suggestion coming from a parent: parents contact your MLAs and the minister of education and describe your feelings and thoughts on the state of public education.
- What do the class sizes look like this year with 16 more students and no extra teachers?
  - Depending on the class, there can be groups of over 30 students. Bishop Pinkham also had an increase from 6% up to 22% of EAL students (English as an additional language) which makes teaching more complex.
