- The 24-25 'CBE Student Survey' indicates that:
 - 67.18% of students understand what digital citizenship means at school.
 - 79.18% of students treat people with the same respect online as they would face to face
 - 44% of students say they take care of themselves by making sure they don't have too much screen time
 - 95.53% of students indicate that they are responsible for themselves and their actions
